In this presentation, you will complete your "Daisy Flower Garden" Journey! This journey will teach you about the Girl Scout

In this step, you will start learning about the traits that make up a great Girl Scout. You will accomplish this by learning some of the Girl Scout law and how you can use it in your daily life. You only have to complete one of the options on the next slides to earn this award.

## Part 1: The Watering Can Award






## Option 1:

Create a flower out of paper

Create a paper flower using the instructions on the next slides. Then learn the importance of watering your at-home flowers using your paper flower. Learn responsibility at home using this paper flower as well!

#### Instructions on how to make a paper flower:

**STEP 1:** Have a small, thin piece of paper, preferably origami paper.





the paper from the corner, to make a triangle.





**STEP 4:** Fold that triangle in half again to make a smaller triangle.







step 5: Take the top of the triangle and fold it in, to make that solid line.







**STEP 6:** Then cut the mini triangle off the newly line you made.







#### How to water your flower:

Once you have made your flower, use a blue marker and add blue water drops on your flower. This is like a real flower, because when you add water to your flower, it grows! If you have flowers at home, you can practice responsibility by making sure you water your flowers consistently.

## Option 2: Play the Garden Scamper Game



This is a activity you can do with a friend, parent, or sibling!

This activity connects to a couple lines of the GS Law.

The steps are on the next slide.

#### Steps:

- 1. Explain the participants that they will need to be "honest and fair" and "courageous and strong" as they play this game.
- 2. Designate a starting line and a finish line on opposite sides of the room.
- 3. Split up the participants. Have one girl stand behind the finish line and the rest stand behind the start line. If there are only two players, have each person stand on the opposite side of the room. Have one group stand behind the starting line and the other group stand behind the finish line



#### Steps:(pt. 2)



- 4. Explain the rules of the game.
- The girl at the front of the finish line will call out the name of a garden critter such as a rabbit, bird, squirrel, grasshopper, etc.
- The girl at the front of the other start line must move like that critter to get across the room.
- When they get to the finish line, the girl must then call out a new critter so the next girl in line can travel across the room, moving like the new critter. Girls cannot repeat a critter.
- If a girl doesn't move like the critter, she must go to the back of the line.
- Continue playing the game until 10 critters have been called out. If all the participants are on the other side before finishing the game, have the girl who just traveled to the next side call out a critter for the first girl in line to travel to the other side.
- After playing the game, ask the participants how they showed they were "honest and fair" and "courageous and strong" during the game.

In this step, you will learn how to make the world a better place. You can do this by completing one of the take action projects on the following slides. You only have to complete one of the options/ take action projects to earn this award, but you could do all three or two out of three of the options if you want to!

### Part 2: The Golden Honey Bee Award





## Option 1:

Pick up trash

For this step, you will complete a game/worksheet in order to pick up at least 150 points worth of trash.



For this step, you have the mission of cleaning up the trash around your house and backyard!

Just the simple act of cleaning up can make an area so much more beautiful and can even put others in a better mood!

Instructions: Print or copy the Point Tracking Table. Then, look around your house and your backyard for pieces of trash. After picking up all the trash, count how many pieces of trash you picked up. Use the point system determine how many points you earned. If there was not enough trash to pick up the first day, pick up more trash the next day. You win the game by either earning 150 points or completing 5 days of picking up trash. Even when you complete this challenge, you should continue to pick up trash around your house!

Important: Make sure to wash your hands when you are done picking up the trash. When completing this activity, only pick up trash from inside your house or in your backyard in order to stay safe, as you do not know where the trash in a public area, like a park, came from. Unless it is your own trash, you should not pick up trash from a public area, unless you have gloves.



## Option 2:

Make a Love Bug

You can give them to a friend or family member, but make sure to social distance when delivering your love bugs.

#### Gather these Materials:

- Smooth, round rocks
- Plastic wiggly eyes and glue (or use paint)
- Paint in assorted colors
- Jewelry pin backings or magnets (OPTIONAL)
- Paint brushes
- Clear acrylic spray (OPTIONAL)
- Newspapers

INSTRUCTIONS AND EXAMPLES ON NEXT SLIDES..

#### Instructions:

- 1.) Unfold newspapers and place them down on the ground/table for painting.
- 2.) Place rocks on the newspaper for painting.
- 3.) Paint rocks to look like bugs using paint brushes and assorted paints. Paint the eyes or glue to googly eyes on one end of the rock before you paint. The end with the eyes is the head.
- 4.) When you are done, you can spray with acrylic (OPTIONAL). Let the rocks you painted dry.
- 5.) When dry, glue pins or magnets on the back of the love bugs. Magnetic love bugs can be put on the fridge.
- 6.) Deliver your love bugs to friends or family members. Attach a nice note explaining why that person is important to you.

## Option 3:


Make seed bombs

## Option 1:

## Option 2:

Use a board game to learn the girl scout law!

Above is the link to the game board you need. If you do not have a printer, then you can create your own game board by drawing the rectangle pattern on a different piece of paper. For this game you will also need a dice, and a few pennies (to use as your game pieces). Roll the die, and move forward that many spaces, recite the corresponding line of the girl scout law. For example, a blue space corresponds to "Honest and Fair" because "Honest and Fair" is on the blue rectangle on the following page.—Once you reach the **Finish** you are done and you have won the game!
