Step 2: Speak out

So, what is a stereotype? A stereotype is a fixed and/or oversimplified image or idea of a certain type of person or thing.

How do these ads make you feel? Excluded? Offended? Do you agree with them?

If you could change the ad, what would you do?





Step 3: Try out

what comes to mind when you think of a bee? Is it black and yellow? Does it make honey? That's a stereotype! The most important bees in our lives aren't yellow and black and don't make honey - but they do need our help! If we have more native flowers in the area, we'll have more native bees and the native bees are so very important to the food we eat (much more so than honey bees).

Imagine the seed ball as a stereotype that you dislike. Think of ways you can prove the stereotype is incorrect, and when you finish, throw the seed ball outside as a way of "throwing away the stereotype."
